#### **3.2 COMPLEX SENTENCE:**

A complex sentence has one independent clause (sentence) and at least one dependent clause. A dependent clause has a subject and a verb, but is not a complete thought, so it cannot stand alone. These two clauses are joined by a Marker word, like: after, although, as, as if, because, even, while.

An example is: "He went to the party after he did his chores".

#### 3.3 COMPOUND SENTENCE:

A compound sentence has two simple sentences, or two independent clauses. The clauses are connected with a coordinator or coordinating conjunction, or with a semi colon. Two examples are: "Murugan waited for the bus, and it arrived on time" and "You have waited very patiently; finally, the day has arrived".

#### 3.4 ONE COMPOUND COMPLEX SENTENCE

A compound complex sentence contains a coordinating conjunction and an adverb or relative clause.

Eg. I would like to read the books which were written by Thomas Hardy, but they are not available.

**EXPECTED ANSWER**: Our father taught us many lessons which helped us succeed in life, and we will miss him greatly.



#### 4.3 PERFORMANCE OF THE STUDENTS FOR THE FIRST QUESTION:



For the above questions from this exercise (one compound complex sentence) only a few students were able to combine the sentence correctly because the students did not know the rule and its function of this topic. In question no. 1 only 6 were able to give the correct answer while 20 got wrong answer and 9 not responded out of 35. In question no.2, only 5 were able to give the correct answer whereas 22 got wrong answer and 8 not responded.

#### 5. LEARNERS' KNOWLEDGE IN THE ONE COMPOUND COMPLEX SENTENCE

The data was collected from the first year Mechatronics Engineering students. The total target of the informants was 35 for this study. The study reveals that the learners were not ably practicing the use of certain parts of grammar like complex and compound sentences, phrasal verbs etc., in the English class room during their school days. When the learners move to the college level they found it difficult to frame the sentences with correct structural formation in English. Therefore, the learners were expected to expose themselves to practice certain parts of grammar in English which is necessary to improve their writing skill.

## 6. DIFFICULTIES FACED BY THE STUDENTS TO COMBINE THE SENTENCES INTO ONE COMPOUND COMPLEX SENTENCE

This study enumerates that the informants found it very difficult to combine sentences into one compound complex sentence because the students were not aware of the rules and its functions of simple, compound and complex sentences. This is due to less practice and also the learners were not focused in learning certain parts of grammar in the English class room. Therefore, grammar should be taught with interest by the English teacher by using real life examples and also the teacher has to modify his/ her teaching according to the level, capacity and what the students expect from the teacher to make interesting to learn English language happily.

#### REMEDIAL MEASURES

The following remedial measures would help the learners to perform well.

- 1. English teacher should teach the grammar topic with interest by explaining with more real life examples.
- 2. The teacher should teach according to the background of the learners in the classroom.
- 3. The English teacher should drill the learners to be thorough in grammar by making the learners do the exercises independently once the topic was completed.
- 4. Teaching methodology in teaching grammar is to be modified by teacher according to the expectations of the learners.

#### 7. CONCLUSION

This study has identified the problems and difficulties among the learners of  $L_2$  in combining one compound complex sentence through samples collected from first year Mechatronics Engineering students. Hereby, the study reveals that the learners of  $L_2$ , even the students studied in English medium background in their schools were not up to the expected level, where the teacher anticipated good responses from them. So, this should be taken care of by the English teacher and moreover, it is their responsibility. Hence, only through effective practice and training the learners would be able to enhance their use of English.
