

VELU NAATCHIAAR - A FEROCIOUS TIGRESS

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The formation of a baby in the royal womb was a climax for Naatchiar and her bliss was boundless and it was reaching the point of culmination over the days. During the ninth month of conception, as a mark of perfection of conception, a festival used to be celebrated in the name of *Valaikaappu or Seemantham*. This was the right time for such a celebration. In commemoration of the occasion the grandfather of Naatchiar viz., ChellamuthuThevar from Ramanathapuram arrived. All kinds of sweets, savouries, fruits, different kinds of variety rice mainly tamarind rice- a favourite food for the pregnant women- were all brought for the occasion.

At the Fort Temple, in front of the Chief Deity, Goddess Rajeswari, all the above things were arranged. All the relatives were assembled singing divine songs in praise of Goddess Rajeswari. Muthathaal embraced her daughter in complete contentment over the cause of the occasion, as she had to confront a stiff criticism and unpleasant remarks for the prolonged period of barrenness. As part of the function, the protagonist – Velunaatchiar was decorated with special attire and mainly glass bangles – a main item of the day. Though a queen, she was no different from an ordinary woman on such occasions; she was all in her shyness; the turmeric paste added glamour to her beautiful cheeks; yet, she could not conceal her shyness.

All relatives returned to their homes after bringing all richness and glamour to the function; however, Muthathaal stayed back with her pregnant daughter to attend to all her needs till delivery. The day of delivery came and the labour pain started; all concerned were very much concerned over the situation praying for a safe delivery; Message was sent to Vaduganaathar. Finally, the baby was born and was with pride and pleasure handed over to the mother by her mother. A fantastic moment for Velunaatchiar and she caressed her heaven sent treasure and reached the height of heavenly joy.

The next day a small function was arranged in the shrine of Goddess Rajeswari for naming the new born baby; Since the baby was fair in complexion, the baby was named as *Vellachi* (*vellai* in Tamil means **white**). This baby was a gifted one as she had mothers to attend to all her needs.

Life is a blend of joys and sorrows; and the Sivagangai was not an exception. The British were looking for an opportunity to subdue them at the right time and this time their enemies came through an English man called De'guard.

THE INFURIATED MOB

The new princess VellachiNaatchiar was being brought up with the greatest importance and care; hence the child enjoyed all pride and pleasure of SivagangaiSeemai Palace. In the meanwhile, after the demise of the father of Velunaatchiar, the 12 year old MuthuRamalingaVijayaRagunathaSethupathi was made the king and ThiruvayiNaatchiar was entrusted the administrative work of SethupathiSeemai. These arrangements were made by the government of Ramanathapuram. "After all, a 12 year old lad has been made the king;

this can well be exploited to invade and conquer SethupathiSeemai”.....Such was the vicious plan of Arcot Nawab. On the other side, all Marathas were secretly plotting to capture Ramanathapuram; in this way, Ramanathapuram seemed to be targeted and isolated. But, ThiruvayiNaatchiar was not a vulnerable force to these enemies; also, the support of DalavaiVellayanChervaikkarar was a formidable force to defend Ramanathapuram Province. The Maharashtra King Thullaaji himself had been conducting the forces under his leadership; this war lasted for thirty days. Queen ThiruvayiNaatchiar managed the Maratha forces from being inside the fortress. ThiruvayiNaatchiar and Pitchai Pillai devised a plan to ruin the Tanjore forces that had besieged the fortress. On the west of Ramanathapuram there was a big reservoir with water full to its capacity; by causing a small breach in the reservoir, floods can be caused to destroy the forces besieging the fortress. The execution of the plan was amazingly successful and as a result most of the forces were destroyed. Thullaaji, the king of Tanjore surrendered, received compensation for all loss incurred in the war and then returned to his province. This was followed by calmness all over for some time.

Consequently, Arcot Nawab declared a war the very next year against Ramanathapuram under the joint leadership of his son UmthathulUmran and the Captain of Parangipet Captain.

Hence as a follow up action, Sivagangai became the next target of the British and the Nawab. The British Captain Smith and Pant chore plotted against Sivagangai. To confront Muthuvaduganatha directly face to face in the war was not possible and that too, when he was assisted by ChinnaMaruthu and Periya Maruthu. Hence it could be made possible only through treacherous means and hence they were waiting for an apt time.

Thevar had a plan to visit the temple first and then to attend the discussion session. He had brought Younger NaatchiarGowri with him. Time had turned out to be bad and was prosperous for scheming villains. And political justice had been sold out for dirty ends and vice was replacing virtue. For all this, Pan Chore responded just by displaying his unpleasant teeth and cackled. "This is our plan to trap you alone. After a lot of plotting and planning, we got you here and how can we leave you and if I leave you, I will be killed; this is a "do or die" situation! Also, in a short while Sivagangai Fortress will come under our control; so you have no business on the earth; hence bid farewell and take leave with bliss. With an atrocious cackle, unexpectedly he pressed the trigger and the bullet killed GowriNaatchiar. Even before gaining balance after holding Gowri, another bullet was released which pierced through Vaduganaathar ship. Thus both had fallen dead, one on the other just at the entrance of the temple, with no one to attend them. Pan chore proceeded towards Sivagangai with his army. When the news reached Thandavarayan, he rushed to Kalayaar Temple with Vellachi and others. When VeluNaatchiar looked at the gruesome sight, she felt desperate and depressed. She witnessed the roaring lion lying on the ground motionless. The mountain lay shattered down on the ground! The royal king who used to decorate the throne with his stately posture had fallen down! And the innocent younger one too had been shot dead mercilessly.

The gravity of the sad situation was the reason. After dinner, VellachiNaatchiar was sent to a separate room with a maid and the rest started the discussion. After heaving a long sigh, Gopalanayakkar initiated the talk thus: "It is my duty to inform our Pillai that a spy came last night with a bad news; the Sivagangai Fortress will be captured within a day or two and Maruthu brothers will join us shortly. Henceforth, we will have to face several challenges. At this juncture, the future course of action should be planned meticulously."

The queen, after listening to all this, called Nayakkar and submitted to him certain secret tasks as a request. She further proceeded, "As of now, we cannot face the combined forces of Nawab and the British. Hence my plan will be like this. First of all, I want to form an army- well disciplined and experienced soldiers will be selected and imparted training at confidential camps. The second proposal will be the production of quality arms in workshops by skilled weapon smiths. Number three- I want a section of army exclusively of ladies. So also, the mighty queen has sought asylum as a guest before a person like Gopalanayakkar, having lost everything in life. The only option before her was to form an army, train them and equip them with arms and defeat the Nawab and the British. The preliminary work in this regard had been entrusted to Gopalanayakkar. She had also wanted all the training camps in uninhabited and secret places. Such locations had been identified by the joint efforts of GopalaNayakkar, ThandavarayanPillai and Maruthu brothers; such locations were Thiruppathur Fort, Chakrapathi Fort, AranmanaiSiruvayal Fort, Padamathur Fort, Pandiyan Fort, Ariyakurichi Fort, and Manamathurai Fort and so on. These places were totally deserted areas. Only these forts were going to serve as weapon warehouse, Confidential Meeting Places, Training Centres for the soldiers, and military exercises. Also these forts will serve as hideout for the queen for the next eight years.

Trustworthy Spies were sent around all the places for recruiting soldiers for the New Army. Women were also recruited in the army. Maruthu brothers imparted training to the new recruits in the martial art of *Kuyili*. The furnace at the weapon smith’s factory reflected the fury of VeluNaatchiar. Swords and spears and arrows and the like were being made and piled up in large quantities without break. In the meanwhile, VeluNaatchiar visited all the training camps and sometimes she herself imparted training to the soldiers. She formed a Women Unit in the Army and named it after Child Udayal, in her memory. DalavaiThandavarayanPillai and VellachiNaatchiar stayed at Virupatchi Fort. From here, Pillai analysed the political situation and the political crisis of Sivagangai and enlightened the queen on the same; the other subjects for discussion were warfare strategies and the Military Training being imparted to their soldiers.

It was at this time that news about the arrival of Hydar Ali reached VeluNaatchiar through GopalaNayaka; the possible arrival of Hydar Ali seemed to VeluNaatchiar a good and auspicious sign and was delighted. Without any delay, VeluNaatchiar jumped into action in making efforts to meet Hydar Ali with the help of GopalaNayakkar. She was looking for right time to approach Hydar Ali and she was finalizing issues like what type of assistance and at what appropriate time can she request Hydar Ali for the assistance. She was also thinking about the means of reaching Dindigul fort.

Finally, Gopalanayakkar received the consent from Hydar Ali for the Interview. This made Naatchiar extremely happy and she prepared herself to send note to Dindigul fort. Gopalanayakkar had informed Hydar Ali that four soldiers would bring message on horseback. Hence Hydar Ali had instructed his security at the Main Gates about this. According to rules, only people with Identity could enter the fort. Four soldiers with good physique on horseback came to the fort. They showed their Identity and entered the fort and walked towards the Court. When they were asked about Queen VeluNaatchiar, one among the four soldiers removed the headband and the cloth covering the face, the complete court turned still and silent in amazement.

Rani VeluNachiyar and her daughter VellachiNachiyar lived under the protection of Hyder Ali at Virupakshi near Dindigul. Frustrated by the joining of forces against him, the Nawab ordered that VeluNachiyar and the Marudhu brothers were permitted to return to Sivaganga to rule the country subject to payment of Kist to the Nawab. Abiding by this Order, Rani VeluNachiyar accompanied by the Marudhu brothers and VellachiNachiyar entered Sivaganga. An agreement was reached whereby Rani VeluNachiyar was permitted to govern the Sivaganga Country and ChinnaMarudhu; the younger was appointed her minister and the elder VellaiMarudhu as the Commander-in-chief. Thus the widow Queen VeluNachiyar succeeded her husband in 1780.

The Queen VeluNachiyar granted powers to the Marudhu brothers to administer the country in 1780. VeluNachiyar died a few years later, but the exact date of her death is not known (it was about 1790).

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
